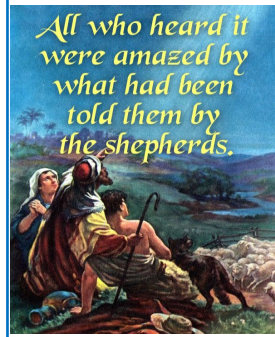

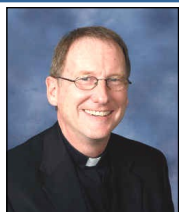

**A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR**

As part of the three-year Eucharistic Initiative in our Church, our diocese is holding two Eucharistic Conferences, one in Fort Wayne and one in South Bend. The Fort Wayne event will be held right here at St. Charles on Saturday, January 14, from 9:00 a.m.-3:00 p.m. The day will include

Mass at 11:45 a.m., talks by Bishop Rhoades, lunch, and a question-and-answer session with the Bishop. Registration will be cut off at 1000 people, so do not delay. To register, go to the diocesan website, [diocesefwsb.org/eucharist-events](http://diocesefwsb.org/eucharist-events). It should be an inspiring day and we are honored to host it here at St. Charles.

The response from our Advent Giving Tree was again overwhelming this year. The St. Vincent de Paul Society, St. Patrick's Food Pantry, Catholic Charities, and our World Youth Day pilgrims have all expressed gratitude for the tremendous response. This is a generous parish.

The Electric Works has been much in the news as parts of some buildings are beginning to open for business. One very interesting aspect of these buildings: there will be an ecumenical Christian prayer room on the campus. Donors have contributed to construct the room and pay rent for the first couple of years, with the idea that there will be people in the room in prayer 24 hours a day. Prayer is specifically asked for our city and our nation. [Of course, Catholics are familiar with round-the-clock prayer rooms. Both St. Jude and St. Vincent have perpetual adoration chapels where the Blessed Sacrament is exposed.] While the Blessed Sacrament will not be kept in an ecumenical prayer room, we still would like to support this ecumenical initiative and join with other Christians in prayer. There will be a dedication ceremony held in the old GE Club Room this Saturday, Jan. 7, from 6:30 p.m.-8:30 p.m. I will join other faith leaders and civic leaders in leading a prayer at that event. Then, on Sunday evening, Jan. 8, we will have a St. Charles hour in the chapel from 6:00 p.m.-7:00 p.m. It will simply be an hour for personal prayer in a room decorated with a cross and other Christian symbols. If you would like to stop by and spend some quiet prayer time while encouraging ecumenical relations and checking out this new space, come join us.

With Christmas falling on a Sunday, we had the longest possible Advent this year, but the shortest Christmas season. The Feast of the Holy Family will fall on Friday. Next Sunday will be Epiphany, and the Christmas season will end the next day as we remember the Baptism of the Lord on Monday, January 9.

**Pre-K4 & Kindergarten Registration Coming Soon!  
 January 17, 2023!**



I wish to invite you to our Kindergarten & Pre-Kindergarten registration day on Tuesday, January 17th. Registration will be held in the afternoon from 1:15 p.m.-2:30 p.m. in Rooms C & D of the Hession Center, or you may attend the evening session from 6:00 p.m.-7:00 p.m. All

parents are asked to park in the rear of the school in the church parking lot and enter through door # 3 near the gym. If unable to attend, please call the school office (484-3392) to arrange for an alternate registration day.

**Kindergarten:** For this coming school year 2023-2024, we will be offering full-day Kindergarten with a classroom size limit of 23 students per class with an aide assisting the teacher. Our school day runs from 7:50 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. If needed, for an additional fee, Beforecare and Aftercare service is available for all students. The registration fee of \$50 is included in the overall tuition costs and is not a required payment at this time.

**Pre-Kindergarten four-year-old Program:** We will be offering two sections of five-day Pre-Kindergarten classes (A.M., P.M., or Full-day). Our morning program will run from 7:50 a.m. - 11:00 a.m. and our afternoon program will run from 11:50 a.m. - 3:00 p.m. A separate \$50 Pre-K registration fee is required.

Our January registration for our Kindergarten and Pre-K 4 Programs is early enough to ensure that parish families of St. Charles Borromeo have a first opportunity to register their children. Please bring to registration:

1. A copy of your child's birth certificate and baptismal certificate even if baptized at St. Charles
2. A copy of your child's immunization record
3. The \$50.00 nonrefundable registration fee (PreK)

This is a very exciting time for our parents and young people. We want to ensure your child's school experience is a faith-filled, engaging, and supportive experience. ## Eucharistic Reflection for January Transformation in Christ.

The Eucharist enables in us a personal and moral transformation that reaches out to every sphere of human life. The love of Christ can permeate all our relationships: with our families, friends, and neighbors. Our relationship with Christ extends to all human beings, whom we are to love with that very same love that forms our communion with the Lord. This love extends particularly and preferentially to the poor and the most vulnerable. We all need to be consistent in bringing the love of Christ not only to our personal lives, but also to every dimension of our public lives. Lay people who exercise some form of public authority have a special responsibility to form their consciences in accord with the Church's faith and the moral law, and to serve the human family by upholding human life and dignity. ### Eucharistic Saint for Jan – St. Elizabeth Ann Seton.

She was born in New York City in 1774 and belonged to New York's high society. Reared a staunch Episcopalian, she learned the value of prayer, Scripture and a nightly examination of conscience. Elizabeth married a wealthy businessman, but at age 30, she became widowed and penniless, with five small children to support. While in Italy with her dying husband, Elizabeth witnessed the Catholic faith in action. Three basic points led her to become a Catholic: belief in the Real Presence, devotion to the Blessed Mother and conviction that the Catholic Church led back to the apostles and to Christ. To support her children, she opened a school in Baltimore, from which the Sisters of Charity were formed. She died in 1821 and became the first American-born citizen to be canonized.
