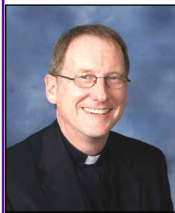

**A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR!**



This week is a special time in which we remember our beloved dead and we focus on the Kingdom of Heaven. Tuesday, November 1, is **All Saints Day, a Holy Day of Obligation**. Holy Day Masses will be celebrated Monday evening at 6:30 p.m., and Tuesday at 6:15 a.m., 8:15 a.m. and 6:30 p.m.

Wednesday is All-Souls Day, a day to pray for those who have died, helping them on the way if they are in purgatory. We will have a special Mass on Wednesday evening at 6:30 p.m., reading the names of those who have had funerals in the past year and lighting a candle for each of them. (We have a list of all of the St. Charles funerals in the past year. If you have a loved one whose funeral was not at St. Charles, please call Cece at the parish office and we can add them to our list.)

Our parish book with Names of the Dead will be placed near the altar for the month of November. Feel free to add names which are not already in the book. (We have used the same book for a number of years.)

A plenary indulgence is offered to those who visit a cemetery and pray for the dead during the first week of November, November 1-8. You must receive Holy Communion, offer prayers for the Pope, and go to Confession within 20 days in asking for the indulgence. I will celebrate Mass at Catholic Cemetery on All Soul's Day, Wednesday, at 2:00 p.m. If the weather is good, it will be at the outdoor altar. If not, we will be in the old mausoleum. I am told that the gates at Catholic Cemetery will remain open until 8:00 p.m. during this week. A person can park at the funeral home and walk into the cemetery even if gates are closed.

Redeemer Radio sent a letter of thanks for our generous contributions to their Fall Sharathon. Our parish pledges added up to \$10,234 and the total for the Sharathon was \$300,000. Thank you to all who helped.

Finally, I point out an interesting video. Brigham Young University produces 25-minute videos, each featuring two American artists and the faith life that contributes to their art. They recently aired a video featuring Gwyneth Thompson-Briggs, the artist who painted the paintings for our renovation. It is a beautiful video.
