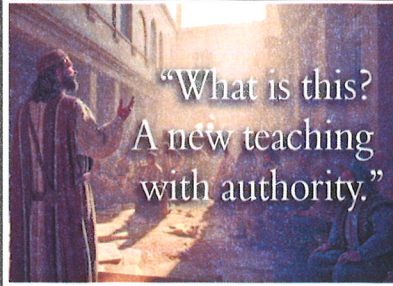

A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

We begin today our Annual Catholic Schools Week. It is a time when we remember just how important our Catholic schools have been in teaching the faith and in bringing generations of children closer to Christ. We currently have 800 children enrolled in our parish school, encouraged to live the faith.

Ever since the Indiana Choice Scholarships have been in place, there has been a nagging question: what happens if the legislature ever drops these scholarships or cuts back the amounts awarded to families? A loss of these scholarships would mean a sudden and huge rise in tuition costs for most of our school families. The strategic plan of our parish school includes a goal to build up a fund to protect our families if that should happen. We currently have an endowment fund called the Canter/Hession Fund which can be used only for tuition help in our parish school. Through the years, generous donors have contributed roughly half a million dollars to that endowment. We are now making a move to add another half million dollars from our new bequest into that endowment. We see this as a safety net for our school families in case the laws do change.

Jason Shank gave a wonderful reflection last week on the Eucharist. Unfortunately, at the end of his talk, we left the church to find a serious flood in the Gathering Space. A pipe had broken from an outside spigot and we had water coming in through the wall. I am grateful to our maintenance crew and the parishioners who jumped in to help with vacuuming, sweeping and mopping the water. I am especially grateful to Paul Eisaman, who identified the valve where we could shut down the water flow. The timing could have been much worse; if the flood had happened during the night and no one discovered it before morning, the water likely would have been through the church as well. Regrettably, though, I fear that most of us we went home that evening thinking about plumbing problems instead of Jason's beautiful talk on the Eucharist.

The Sisters of St. Francis of Perpetual Adoration are a fine community of sisters who have been blessed with young vocations. (I'm proud to report that two babies I baptized in the 1990s in South Bend are now full-grown sisters.) Their Motherhouse is in Mishawaka and they offer ministry in schools, hospitals and parishes in northern Indiana, including St. Francis College. The community is offering two upcoming discernment weekends in Mishawaka for young women who might like to find out more about religious life. The dates are Feb. 25-27 and May 17-19. No Catholic school can fulfill its educational role alone. As a community, Catholic schools are nourished and stimulated by the centrality of the word of Christ expressed through knowledge, service, scripture and sacramental tradition. Catholic Schools: United in Faith and Community is a theme on which to build a spirit of the gospel to benefit the human family.

All are invited to help our students and staff celebrate Catholic Schools Week by stopping in the cafeteria after morning Masses this weekend for complementary coffee and donuts. Our school Science Fair was held this past week and the projects of our 4th and 7th graders are displayed in the Parish Hall for your viewing on Sunday morning 8:00 a.m. - 1:00 p.m. Eucharistic Adoration will be available on Thursday this week, following the 8:15 a.m. Mass until Benediction at 2:25 p.m. Please feel free to stop in church and offer prayers for our parish, community, and world. Our Home and School Association is also sponsoring a Skate Night on Wednesday this week at Bell's Rink for students and families. We conclude the week's celebration on Saturday night with our Sixth Annual Borromeo Bash Monte Cardinal Night.

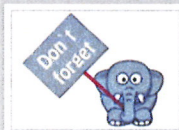

**SCRIP NEWS**

If you didn't have a chance last weekend to pick up your credit statement after Mass, you can stop by the Parish Office between 8:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. on weekdays. You will need to sign the report and turn it back in immediately. Due to the closing, you can no longer save credit statements for the future.

Remember, your portion of the money can be used for many different things, such as school tuition or lunch accounts, donating it to the St. Vincent DePaul Society, Capital Improvement Fund, or other parish ministries. If you do not want to use your credits for these options, you may request a refund in the form of a family rebate check.

We have researched our records and found many outstanding credits from the past. Even if you haven't purchased SCRIP in a while, please call or stop by the Parish Office and check if you have any unclaimed statements. However, if we do not have a signed report by March 31, 2024, we will be required to turn the money over to the State of Indiana as unclaimed funds.

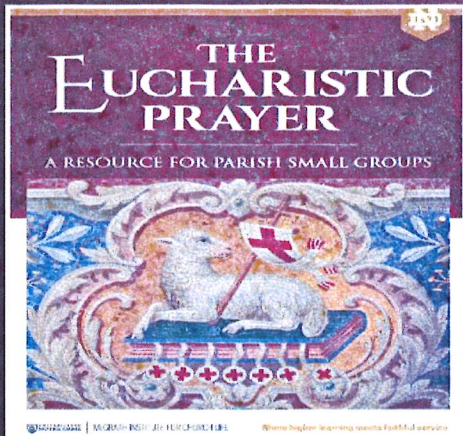
