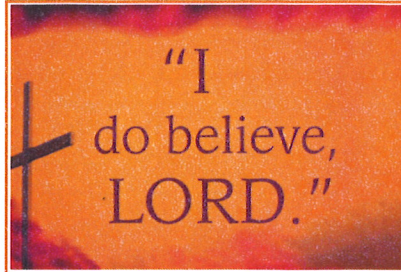

A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

We are very excited for the celebration at our 9:00 a.m. Mass this weekend. Five adults will be welcomed into the Catholic Church. All five are baptized Christians who have discerned a call to the Catholic Church. After making a Profession of Faith, they will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation and

they will join us for the first time in Holy Communion. We welcome Chris Boersma, Amy Neddeff, Josh Perkins, Madison Murphy and Stephanie Miller. On this *Laetare* Sunday, named with the Latin word for "Rejoice," we have special reason to rejoice today.

Exciting news: Some will remember that four years ago, a group of Hispanic adults from St. Patrick Parish came to St. Charles on Good Friday and performed a dramatic presentation of the Stations of the Cross. It was a powerful presentation with costumes and a lot of drama. They are going to return this year. Our parish Good Friday liturgy will be at 12:30 p.m., and the dramatic presentation of the Stations at 3:00 p.m.

Our parish is due for a new parish picture directory. A parish directory is a great tool for getting to know people and building an active parish. The photos for our last directory were taken in the fall of 2016. The parish has changed a lot since then-- people moving in and out of the parish, new babies, kids growing up, deaths, and all of us getting seven years older. Photographers will be here from July 31 until August 16, and we will be scheduling appointments some time during the summer. This time span deliberately straddles the beginning of the school year. We hope to catch college students before they leave for school and also to catch families back in school after returning from summer vacations. There is no cost to the parish and no cost to those who have their photos taken. Anyone who has a photo taken will receive a free 8 x 10 photo and a free copy of the directory. The directory company makes their profit by selling additional photos to those who would like to purchase them. More information will be coming.

There are many opportunities for confessions this week. In addition to our regular hours in the parish, you may want to catch a Penance Service at St. Jude at 6:30 p.m. on Monday; St. John New Haven 6:30 p.m. on Tuesday; or St. Vincent, 6:30 p.m. on Thursday. **We will have no evening Mass at St. Charles on Thursday because all three of our priests are needed at the St. Vincent penance service.**

During the month of February, we were able to help 98 individuals consisting of 55 adults and 43 children. We provided \$ 1,966.00 in rent and motel stays, \$ 1,110.41 in utility payments, \$ 50.00 in cards for gas and food, for furniture and household items, \$ 350.00 and \$ 190.00 for food which provided 1,000 pounds of food. In addition, we give \$ 200.00 monthly to St. Patrick's Parish to help an immigrant family. We spent a total of \$ 3,276.60 to help the needy.

Only through your generosity have we been able to help so many. We are very grateful for your continued support.

Most Precious Blood – Ft. Wayne was founded by the Missionaries of the Precious Blood and features a stained-glass window depicting Christ offering the Eucharist during the Road to Emmaus account. It also includes a statue and first-class relic of St. Gaspar del Bufalo, who founded the Missionaries. Present also are a statue and first-class relic of Pope St. Pius X, who declared that children could receive their first Holy Communion at the age of seven. 17 banners with scripture passages and quotes from various saints regarding the Eucharist are on display. Eucharistic Reflection for March – Conversion.

“At Mass, we say: ‘Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed.’ Venial sins damage but do not destroy our communion with God and the Church. Reception of the Eucharist strengthens our charity and wipes away venial sins, while helping us to avoid serious sins. Mortal sins do rupture our communion with God and the Church. One commits a mortal sin by freely, knowingly, and willingly choosing to do something that involves grave matter and that is opposed to love of God and neighbor. A person in the state of mortal sin is not to receive Holy Communion without having received the Sacrament of Reconciliation. One who receives Holy Communion in a state of mortal sin does not receive the grace of the sacrament, but instead commits the sin of sacrilege by failing to show the reverence due our Eucharistic Lord. BOOK REVIEW BY FR. KOEHL

A professor I had in seminary said that while we priests must daily give ourselves over to an hour of meditative prayer, we must also give ourselves over to an hour dedicated to study. In the pursuit of God, this rings true: we cannot love what we do not know.

Review of:

Unraveling Gender:

The Battle Over Sexual Difference

Dr. John S. Grabowski, TAN Publishers, 2022

Unraveling Gender is written to give an explanation of the state of the question regarding gender ideology and to provide a proper Catholic response to the issue. The author, Dr. John Grabowski, Professor of Moral Theology at the Catholic University of America, leads the reader in a discussion of the proper perspective and response a Catholic ought to have when facing this problem. He begins with saying that a Catholic must be reminded of the need for Truth combined well with Charity, that "the battle" mentioned in the subtitle of the book is not, per se, a battle with individual persons who claim an alternate gender identity, nor even with those who promote the ideology for political gain. Quite to the contrary, those persons are meant to be loved and cared for according to the message of the gospel. "The battle" is against the Principalities and Powers, the demons, great liars, who have brought about this particular lie of gender ideology we see plaguing our world today.

Charity and Truth must go together. Part of loving others is assisting them to live according to the Truth. Therefore, Dr. Grabowski continues with a thorough analysis of the philosophical foundations of gender ideology, particularly pointing out the errors of Marxism, Existentialism, and 2nd Wave Feminism. These philosophies, alongside the societal upheavals of the Industrial, Sexual, and Technological Revolutions, drastically changed the way human beings thought about family life, especially in the West. Humanity thus enters an age of atheistic relativism and secularism, the perfect seed-ground for the Gender Ideology movement. Dr. Grabowski excellently finishes the book with a promotion of Catholic Anthropology in which human beings are made in the image and likeness of God and for the complementarity spoken of in the Book of Genesis: "Male and Female He created them." This book is an approachable read for most adults. In my opinion, even if one has not had a background in philosophy, Dr. Grabowski makes an effort to speak plainly of the issues at hand and provides enough context for the ideas which drive the content of the book. I highly recommend this book, not only because of the need for this information in our age, but also because the excellence of its quality.
