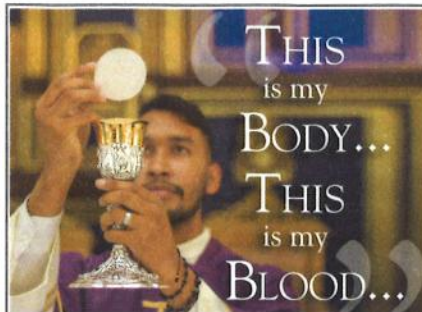

A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

We have begun Holy Week. This is our most intense time of prayer in the Church. It needs to be a time when our focus is on Christ. Again, I encourage all of the school families who travel for Spring Break to find a Catholic parish nearby.

We have abundant opportunities for confessions this week. Check the listing in this bulletin. We have roughly 13 hours scheduled, with two and sometimes three priests available during those hours. We will have confession guides on the Gathering Space table. If you have been away from the sacrament for a while and don't remember the format, pick up a guide. Now is a great time to let the Lord absolve our sin and to bring us back to purity and holiness.

The Chrism Mass will be celebrated at the Cathedral at 7:00 p.m. on Tuesday evening. With the bishop, dozens of priests, trumpets and tympani, this is high liturgy at its best. Priests renew their vows and the sacramental oils which will be used through the year are blessed. Everyone is welcome.

The Sacred Triduum begins on Thursday evening at 7:00 p.m. with the Mass of the Lord's Supper. Our Good Friday service is 12:30 p.m. on Friday and the solemn Easter Vigil begins at 9:00 p.m. on Saturday. We will bless our Easter fire and our new Easter candle, and we will Baptize and Confirm nine new Catholic Christians at the Vigil. Easter Sunday Masses are on our usual schedule: 7:30 a.m., 9:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m., and 5:00 p.m. [Note that there is no 5:00 p.m. Mass on Holy Saturday.]

Please invite friends and family to join us for Easter. We would love to see the church overflowing at each Mass. Spread the word too: our Easter 5:00 p.m. Mass is a great asset for hospital workers, police officers and others who have to work on Easter morning. Very few parishes have an evening Mass on Easter.

For our homebound parishioners who rely on livestreaming, we will livestream the 7:00 p.m. Mass on Holy Thursday, the 12:30 p.m. Service on Good Friday, the 6:30 p.m. Stations of the Cross on Good Friday, and the 11:00 Sunday morning Mass.

The Divine Mercy Novena begins on Good Friday, with nine days of prayer leading to Mercy Sunday. The novena prayers are found in a red brochure on the tables in the back of church. Asking for an indulgence and offering these prayers for mercy, we can help loved ones in purgatory.

May this week be a time of prayer, a time of repentance, and ultimately a time of joy.

The **Annual Chrism Masses** will be held at **Saint Matthew Cathedral** in South Bend on **Monday, March 25**, at 7:00 p.m.; and at the **Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception** in Fort Wayne on **Tuesday, March 26**, at 7:00 p.m. Bishop Kevin C. Rhoades has invited all priests, sisters, brothers, deacons and lay people of the diocese to attend either of these Masses. An interpreter will be present for those who are hearing impaired or deaf. At the Chrism Mass, the Holy Chrism is consecrated and the oil of catechumens and oil of the sick are blessed. This beautiful Mass manifests the communion of the priests with their bishop in the same priesthood and ministry of Christ.



Holy Week begins with the triumphant entrance of Jesus into Jerusalem. We acclaim Him as King as we hold the blessed palms. We then take the palm branches to our homes and put them in a prominent place.

Below is a schedule of Liturgical and Para-Liturgical celebrations for Holy Week:

March 24 - PALM SUNDAY

There will be a blessing of palms at the beginning of each Mass. *For the 11:00 a.m. Mass, (weather permitting) we will gather outside of the Hession Center for the blessing of palms and a solemn procession into the Church.*

March 26 - TUESDAY OF HOLY WEEK

7:00 p.m. Chrism Mass at the Cathedral

Join our Bishop and the Priests of the diocese by livestream as they renew their promises of pastoral service.

March 28 - HOLY THURSDAY (Incense will be used at Mass)

7:00 p.m. Mass of the Lord's Supper

This Mass commemorates the institution of the Holy Eucharist and Priesthood. We are reminded of Christ's great love for us as He gives His life-giving Body and Blood. After Mass, parishioners are encouraged to spend some time in the quiet church (No Adoration) until 9:00 p.m. on Saturday—Paschal Watch. Remain in Church in quiet prayer.

This evening's liturgy is one of the most beautiful of the Church year. This Mass is designed to help us reflect on Christ who is our Light. The joy of the Resurrected Christ should warm our hearts as we see the new members of our parish baptized and received into full communion of the Catholic Church.

March 31 - EASTER SUNDAY

Masses at 7:30 a.m., 9:00 a.m., 11:00 a.m. (Incense will be used at the 9:00 and 11:00 a.m. Masses) and 5:00 p.m.

At the Easter Masses, the **ALLELUIA** resounds as we gather to thank God for redeeming us through his Son's death and resurrection. We will renew our baptismal promises at all Masses.

Paschal Watch

St. Charles is again going to celebrate the Paschal Watch. The Church will remain open from after the Holy Thursday Mass until before the Holy Saturday Mass. Just as Jesus asked the apostles in the Scriptures "can you not watch one hour with me," He is now asking each of us the same questions.

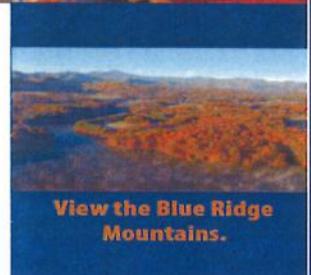

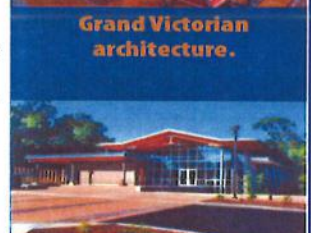

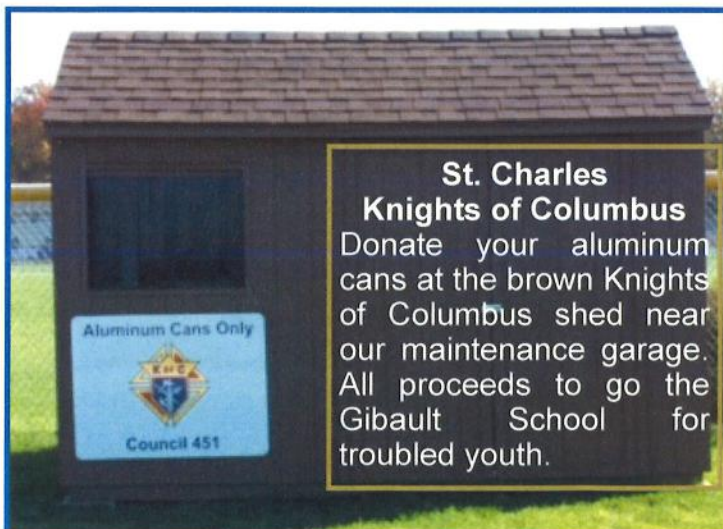
AVA'S GRACE
