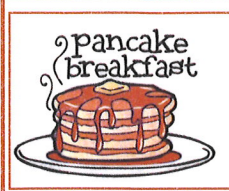
A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

This Wednesday evening, December 13, we will have a Parish Penance Service at 7:00 p.m. Many priests will be here for Advent confessions. This is surely our best preparation for Christmas.

I offer a word about our upcoming Christmas schedule. With a Monday Christmas, the schedule is a little confusing. Our **Sunday Masses** will begin as always with a Saturday Vigil Mass at 5:00 p.m. and Sunday morning Masses on December 24, at the usual times, 7:30 a.m. 9:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. There will be no Sunday 5:00 p.m. Mass because the Christmas Masses begin that evening. **Christmas Masses** will be offered on Sunday, December 24, at 4:00 p.m., 6:30 p.m. and midnight. On Christmas morning, Mass will be offered at 9:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m.. To cover both the Sunday Mass obligation and the Christmas Mass obligation, we all need to take part in two Masses, a Sunday Mass and also a Christmas Mass. Please invite friends, relatives and acquaintances to join us for Christmas. This is a perfect chance to reach out with an invitation.

As I mentioned in a previous column, our parish is receiving a very large bequest. As that news is settling in, let me share my thoughts. First, I will do my best to ensure that this doesn't change the character of our parish. Our parish has always spent money frugally, making sure that every donation is used wisely. That doesn't change. Second, we are going to be sure that a large amount of this donation is shared with the poor. I am putting together a committee to determine just how we do that. I am imagining an endowment that will provide funds every year to help poor parishes and to help committees and agencies that work with the poor. Third, a building project may be a possibility. We are currently working on two building projects: expanding the meeting areas in our youth house and replacing windows in our school. Those projects are already in the works, and with help from the Borromeo Bash and two good years of collections, we have the funding set aside for those projects. We are in need of more meeting space and we may want to reconfigure a building or add on. Fourth, we need to see the inheritance as an exciting opportunity for new ministries and outreach. We will not use it for our current operations and ministries. And finally, I offer a word about stewardship. Like many parishioners, I tithe. With a monthly electronic transfer, the first ten percent of my paycheck goes from my bank account to the parish. I give to the parish not because the parish needs my money, but because I need to give. The way of Christ is the way of self-sacrifice and sharing with others. That is the way I need to follow. I choose to give to the parish because I can see that the parish is using money wisely on causes that are important to me. A large inheritance does not change that.

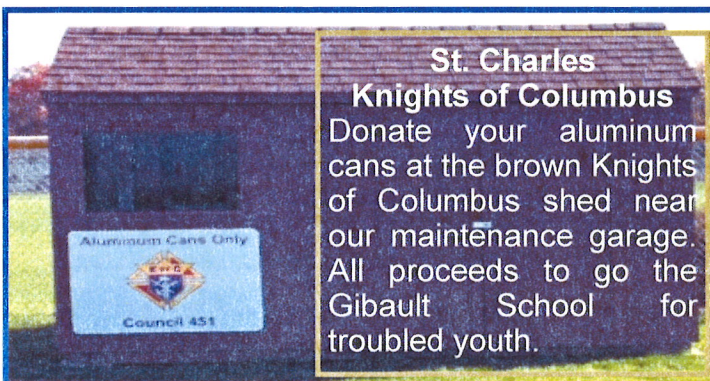


