A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

This is Corpus Christi Weekend, a time when we focus on the great gift we know in the Eucharist, the Body and the Blood of Our Lord. There has been a tradition since medieval times of carrying the Blessed Sacrament in procession through the city streets as a public witness to our faith. Our procession will take place after the 11:00 a.m. Mass. Those who have attended other Masses are very welcome to return and join us.

Several months ago there was much curiosity when concrete was poured in two large circles next to our softball diamond. Last week, short walls were erected on those concrete circles. These are Gaga Ball Pits. Gaga Ball is a very simple form of dodgeball. Many people gather inside the walls, swatting a ball with open hands or fists and dodging to avoid having the ball make contact with feet or legs. A person who has been hit in the legs or feet has to climb out, and the last remaining player wins. I don't think it will ever be an Olympic sport, but it is a simple game which is great fun and great exercise. We thank our Knights of Columbus who put several hours of labor into assembling the gaga pits.

We have been planning for quite some time the replacement of school windows. Using funds from the Borromeo Bash, that project will begin this summer. The current windows are old, small, and not very energy efficient. The tan-colored panels above and below the windows are bowed and easily fall off. The new project will involve larger windows, brick below the windows, and a window in each room which can be used for a fire escape. Because of the time delays in ordering and receiving the windows, we will begin the project in the summertime but probably not be finished much before Christmas.

You may have noticed four trees missing next to the school windows between the Hession Center and the cafeteria. They were very unattractive silver maples which were doing some damage to the asphalt. As we replace the windows, this is a good time to replace the silver maples with nicer trees.

This Thursday will be the first of Fr. Bobby's Bible and Burger nights. Come to the lawn outside the Hession Center windows and bring a lawn chair, a drink, and some food to share. Fr. Bobby will provide burgers and a Bible lesson.

I am leaving Sunday evening for vacation time with my brother and his wife. I'll return the evening of June 13.


