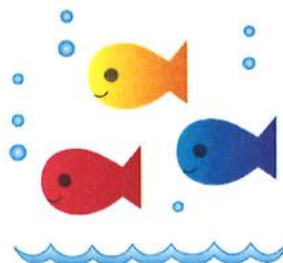

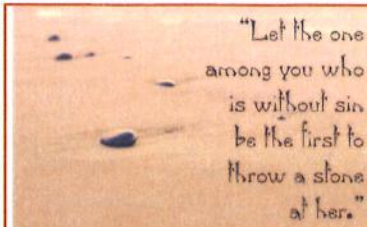

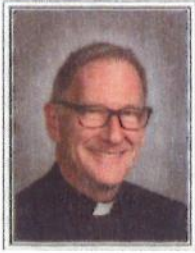

A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

Our parish Lenten Penance Service will be held this Wednesday evening, April 9, at 7:00 p.m. We have nine priests lined up for confessions. If you haven't yet made a Lenten confession, this is a great opportunity. If it has been a long time since you've been to confession or if

you don't remember the format, don't worry. We have sheets in the back of the church which you can follow. If you are not available on Wednesday evening, you may want to consider attending a Penance Service at 6:00 p.m. Monday at St. Elizabeth Ann Seton or 7:00 p.m. Tuesday at St. Jude.

Next weekend, is Passion Sunday, also known as Palm Sunday. We will distribute palms and begin the Mass by remembering Jesus' entry into Jerusalem. At the time of the Gospel, the entire Passion will be read from the Gospel of Luke. This is the beginning of Holy Week. At the 11:00 a.m. Mass the blessing of palms and the opening Gospel will take place in the grassy area next to the Hession Center. We will then process into the church singing our Hosannas. All are welcome to join us outdoors for that procession, beginning at 11:00 a.m.

The Parish Fish Fry will take place on Friday, April 11, from 4:30 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. This is a good chance to get to know other parishioners and also to support the many charitable works done by our Knights of Columbus.

We have a few good books available for loan in the shelves of the north narthex of the church. Feel free to take a book, read it, and bring it back when you are done.

We have a letter from the diocese recommending a new film, *Carlo Acutis: Roadmap to Reality*. The film tells the story of a young man from Italy who died at the age of 15 and will be canonized on April 27. The film will be aired in two Fort Wayne theaters, Regal Coldwater Crossing and Jefferson Point. Both theaters have showings at 4:00 p.m. on April 27, and at 7:00 p.m. on April 28 and 29. LENTEN REGULATIONS

ABSTINENCE-All Catholics who have reached their 14th year are bound to abstain totally from meat on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent.

FASTING-All Catholics from their 18th birthday to their 59th birthday are bound to observe the law of fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting required limiting oneself to one full meal and avoiding food between meals. Light nourishment may be taken on two other occasions during the day. Any good reason will excuse a person from these regulations on particular occasions and for health and dietary needs. Only a contemptuous violation of all regulations would be considered seriously wrong.

Glory's Journey



Glory's feet are coated in dust by sunrise as she begins the long walk to collect water—a journey she has made since she was five. Now, at ten, her small frame bears the weight of a heavy jerrycan, nearly as large as she is. The river she walks to is shallow and muddy, forcing her to scoop water from hand-dug pits. It takes nearly an hour to fill her container. Most days, she is too tired to go to

school. Some days, she doesn't go at all. Yet, despite it all, Glory still dreams of becoming a teacher.

Our Lenten almsgiving project at St. Charles this year is to help build wells in villages of Africa where clean water is difficult to find. We will send a parish donation to Cross Catholic Outreach, which estimates that the average well costs \$8,000. If you would like to help, write a check to St. Charles and mark the memo line "African Wells."

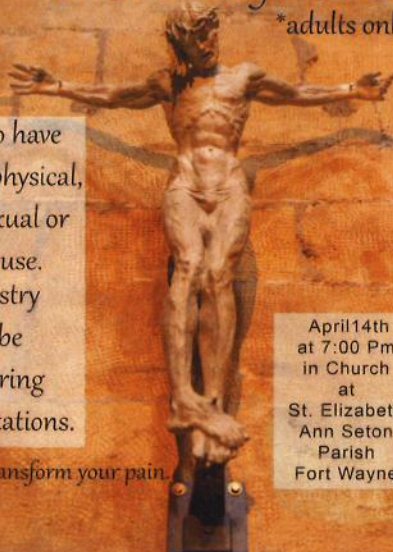

MESSAGE FROM THE DIOCESE FORT WAYNE—SOUTH BEND

It remains important for our church to protect children and young persons from the evils of abuse. The Diocese of Fort Wayne-South Bend remains committed to upholding and following its guidelines, policies and procedures that were implemented for the protection of children and young people. These can be reviewed on the diocese's website, www.diocesefwsb.org, under "Young Protection."

If you have reason to believe that a minor may be a victim of child abuse or neglect, Indiana law requires that you report this to civil authorities. If you or someone you know was abused as a child or young person by an adult, you are encouraged to notify appropriate civil authorities of that abuse. In addition, if alleged abuser is or was a priest or deacon of the Catholic Church, you are encouraged to contact Jodi Marlin, Victim Assistance Coordinator, at (260) 399-1447, or jmarlin@diocesefwsb.org; or Rev. Mark Gurtner, Vicar General of the Diocese of Fort Wayne-South Bend, at P.O. Box 390, Fort Wayne, Indiana 46801; at (260) 399-1419; or at mgurtner@diocesefwsb.org. The diocese is committed to helping prevent the abuse or neglect of children and young people and to assist those who have suffered harm as a result of such abuse.
