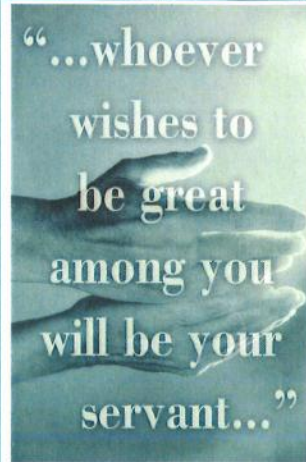

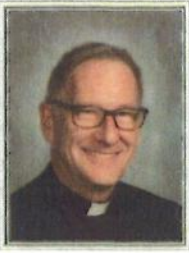

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

On the weekend of October 20 we join Catholics around the world in celebrating World Mission Sunday. We are called to offer our prayers and financial support for the Church's missionary work in Asia, Africa, the Pacific Islands and parts of Latin America and Europe. The theme of this year's collection is "Go and invite everyone to the banquet." Pope Francis chose this theme in reference to Jesus' parable of the wedding banquet (cf. *Mt* 22:1-14), and he reflected beautifully on its meaning in his letter for World Mission Day this year:

"Mission, we see, is a tireless going out to all men and women, in order to invite them to encounter God and enter into communion with him. Tireless! God, great in love and rich in mercy, constantly sets out to encounter all men and women, and to call them to the happiness of his kingdom, even in the face of their indifference or refusal. Jesus Christ, the Good Shepherd and messenger of the Father, went out in search of the lost sheep of the people of Israel and desired to go even further, in order to reach even the most distant sheep (cf. *Jn* 10:16). Both before and after his resurrection, he told his disciples, 'Go!', thus involving them in his own mission (cf. *Lk* 10:3; *Mk* 16:15). The Church, for her part, in fidelity to the mission she has received from the Lord, will continue to go to the ends of the earth, to set out over and over again, without ever growing weary or losing heart in the face of difficulties and obstacles."

The funds raised in the World Mission Sunday collection support the Pontifical Mission Societies, which was founded two hundred years ago by a French laywoman, Blessed Pauline Jaricot. Their work supported the young Church in the United States over many decades, and now we have the opportunity to offer our financial support to our brothers and sisters in over 1,150 mission territories throughout the world. The Pontifical Mission Societies foster the proclamation of the Gospel, the building of churches and the provision of food, education and medical care in vulnerable communities. Last year, they provided grants to 38,000 seminarians, material support to 258,500 religious sisters caring for children and families and 844,000 catechists teaching the faith. They helped sustain 8,700 homes for the elderly and orphaned children.

I would be grateful if you would keep the Pope's missionary efforts in your prayers and give generously to this important collection, which serves the spiritual and temporal needs of so many of our brothers and sisters throughout the world.

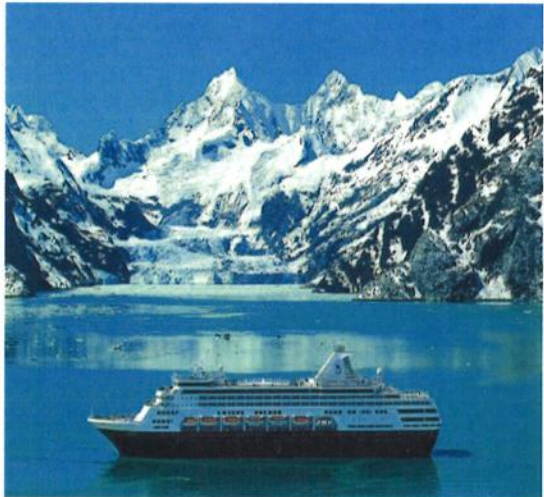
