



40 Days for Life

As we have done now for many years, the Knights of Council 451 along with members of St. Charles parish gathered to participate in the 40 Days for Life. We stood together in prayer and in support of the most defenseless among us, the unborn. According to data available on the internet, the U.S. averaged 82k abortions monthly in 2022, 90k in 2023 and is averaging around 99k in 2024. That is a 20% increase from 2022. At the current pace, nearly 1.2 million children will be aborted in the U.S. this year: children who will never walk the earth, contribute their God given talents or join the rest of us in building a future. Given the divide on this most hotly debated issue, there is little hope this greatest of tragedies will end in the near future. However, like so many things beyond our individual control, we have the strongest of weapons in our arsenal and that is prayer. Let us continue to join in prayer and ask Our Mother for help and Our Father for forgiveness.


